



Rules for Camping Areas

- A minimum separation distance of **3.0 metres** is required between camping units, eg. in between tents, caravans and mobile homes.
- Make yourself familiar with the location and use of firefighting equipment and in how to alert the emergency services.
- Firebreak areas in between marked camping sections must be kept clear and tidy. Parked vehicles, tents, and similar items must be removed immediately if necessary to prevent fire spread between camping sections and to ensure adequate rescue and firefighting access in the event of a fire.
- Motor vehicles must not be parked within camping areas. Motorhomes, camper vans, and similar camping units are exempt. Designated motor vehicles parking areas can be found at the camping section boundary areas.
- Motor vehicles must not be parked in firebreak areas. Loading and unloading are permitted.
- Combustible waste must be placed in waste containers made of non-combustible material. Waste containers must be emptied as needed, and at least once per day.
- Waste containers must be located at least **3.0 metres** from the nearest camping unit.
- Furniture and other combustible items may not be brought into camping areas, except for fixed installations within camping units, sleeping bags, sleeping mats, and other lightweight equipment normally used for camping.
- Open fires are permitted only in designated areas specifically intended for this purpose.
- Cooking appliances may only be used in areas where a minimum separation distance of **3.0 metres** is required between camping units, or at designated fire pits.
- F-gas appliances, including gas barbecues, may only be used in areas where a minimum separation distance of **3.0 metres** is required between camping units.
